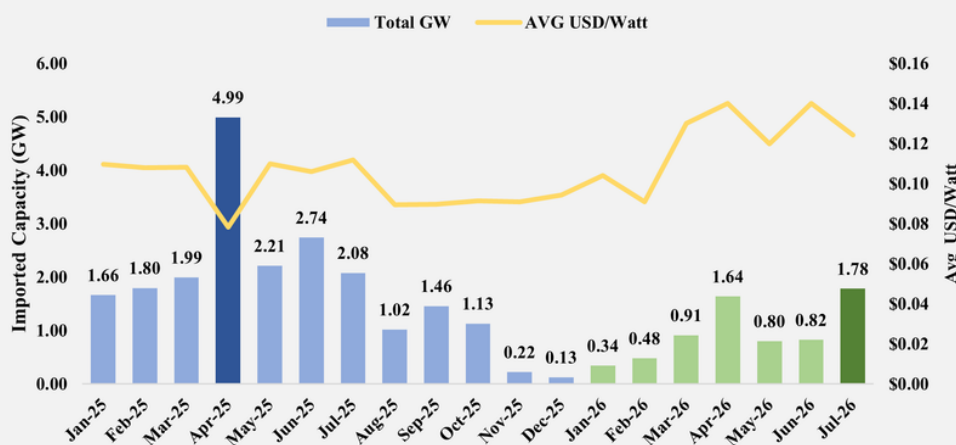

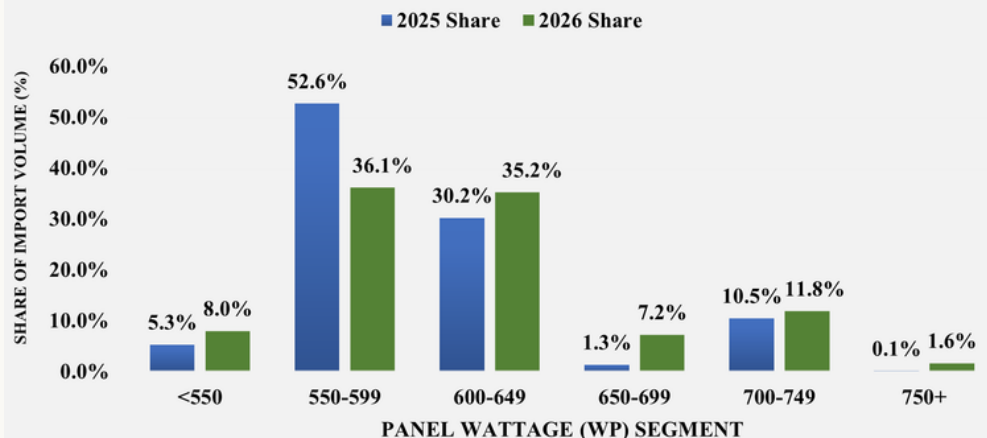
Solar PV Import Capacity vs Average landed Price



Solar PV imports peaked at 4.99 GW in April 2025, plunged to 0.13 GW by December, and recovered to 1.78 GW by July 2026, while average landed prices generally increased.

Pakistan's solar market is rapidly shifting toward higher-wattage modules, with 600W+ panels rising from 46.8% of imports in 2025 to 56.6% in 2026.

Key Takeaways

- Imports are rebuilding: after cooling from the April-2025 net-metering rush, monthly volume bottomed at 0.125 GW in Dec-2025 and has climbed 14x since reaching 1.78 GW in July 2026, the strongest month in a full year.
- Panels are getting bigger: the 600-649W class nearly overtook 550-599W as the dominant format, growing from 30% to 35% of imports, as sub-550W and 550-599W panels give way to higher-wattage classes.
- 2026 momentum is broad-based: four of the last five months posted month-over-month gains, and April and July 2026 each individually outpaced the entire three-month Q4-2025 total (1.48 GW) on their own.
- The bigger picture is still remarkable: Pakistan has imported over 28 GW of solar capacity across Jan-2025-Jul-2026 combined a scale of deployment that places it among the fastest-growing solar markets in the world.

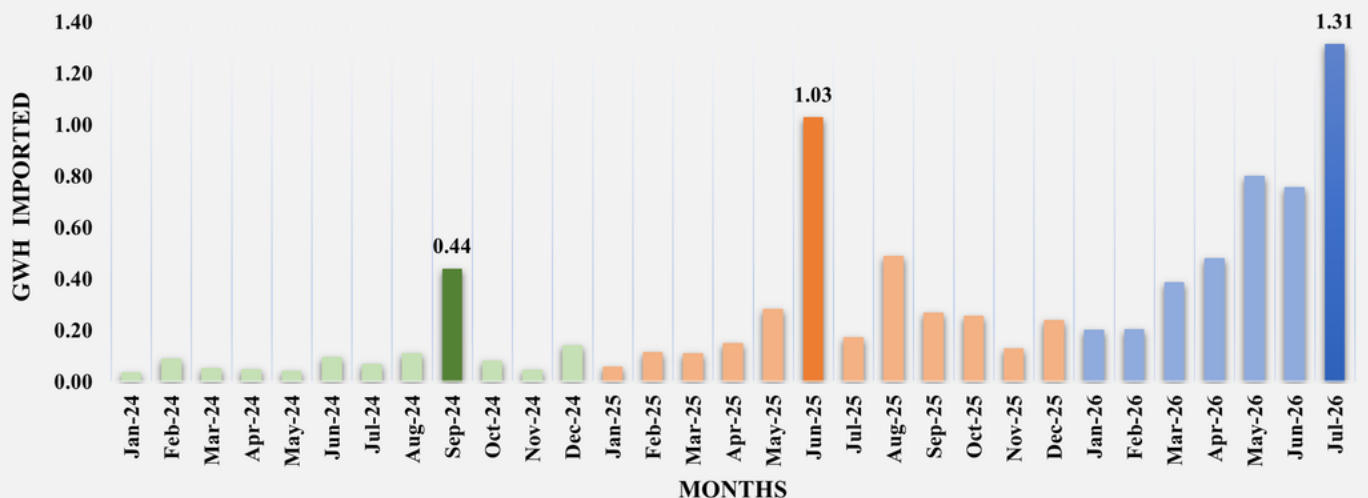

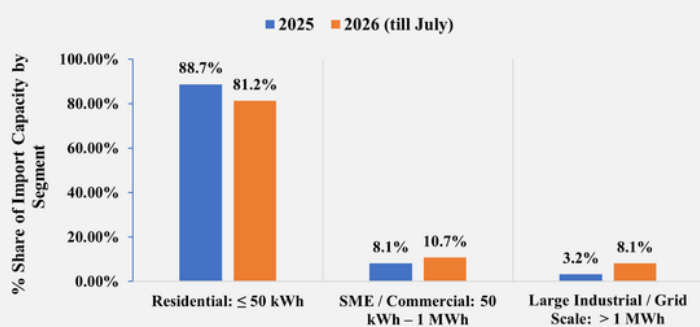

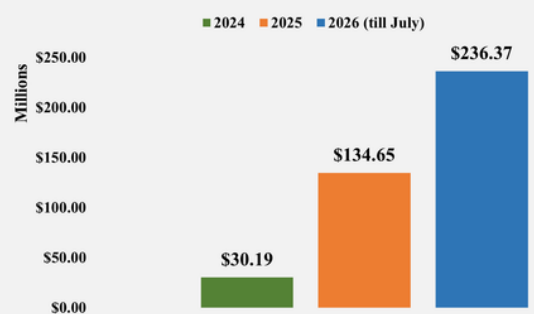
Monthly Li-Ion Batteries Imports (Jan 2024 - July 2026)

Key Takeaways

- Explosive growth: cumulative BESS imports since Jan-2024 have reached 8.7 GWh, with monthly volume climbing 36x from 36 MWh in Jan-2024 to a record 1.31 GWh in July 2026.
- 2026 already ahead of 2025: in just seven months, 2026 imports (4.15 GWh) have surpassed the entire 2025 total (3.31 GWh) up 116% on the same Jan-Jul period last year.
- Diversifying beyond rooftop: Large Industrial/Utility-scale share of imports grew from 3.2% (2025) to 8.1% (2026 YTD), and SME/Commercial from 8.1% to 10.7%, as storage moves past pure residential backup.
- Capital is scaling with volume: import value has grown from \$30M (2024) to \$135M (2025) to \$236M in just Jan-Jul 2026 already more than 2024 and 2025 combined.

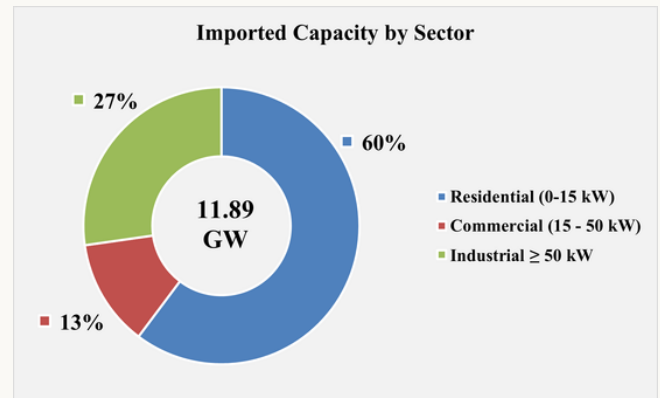
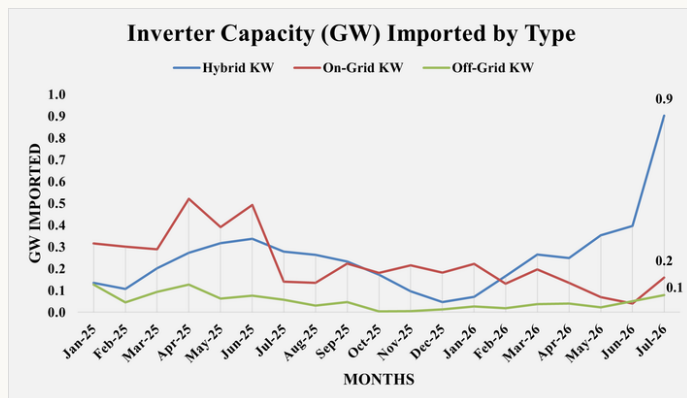
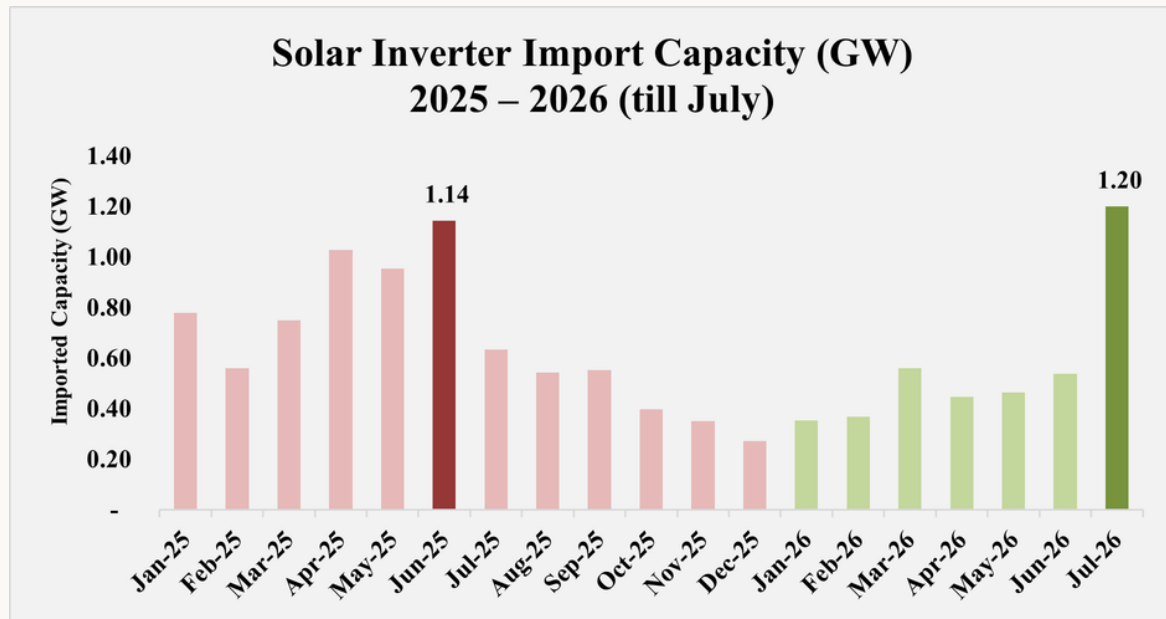

Key Takeaways

- July 2026 sets a new high: 1.20 GW of inverters imported the strongest month across the whole dataset, and a 4.4x rebound from December 2025's low.
- Hybrid inverters are taking over: hybrid share of imports jumped from 30% in 2025 to 61% in 2026 YTD, while pure on-grid share fell from 43% to 24% a clear pivot toward backup-capable systems.
- Residential demand holds steady: the residential segment (0-15 kW) held roughly 55% of import volume in 2025 and rose to about 62% in 2026 YTD, even as overall volumes fluctuated month to month.
- Cumulative deployment: Pakistan has imported 11.9 GW of solar inverter capacity since Jan-2025, worth over \$667 million in landed import value.



Advocacy Spotlight

#StopSunTax Campaign

20 April – 30 June 2026

PSA led a targeted pre-budget advocacy campaign to push for a reduction in solar import tariffs ahead of Pakistan's federal budget. Engaging government ministries, parliamentarians, think tanks, and industry chambers, the campaign reframed solar taxation as a macroeconomic issue rather than a niche energy concern.
